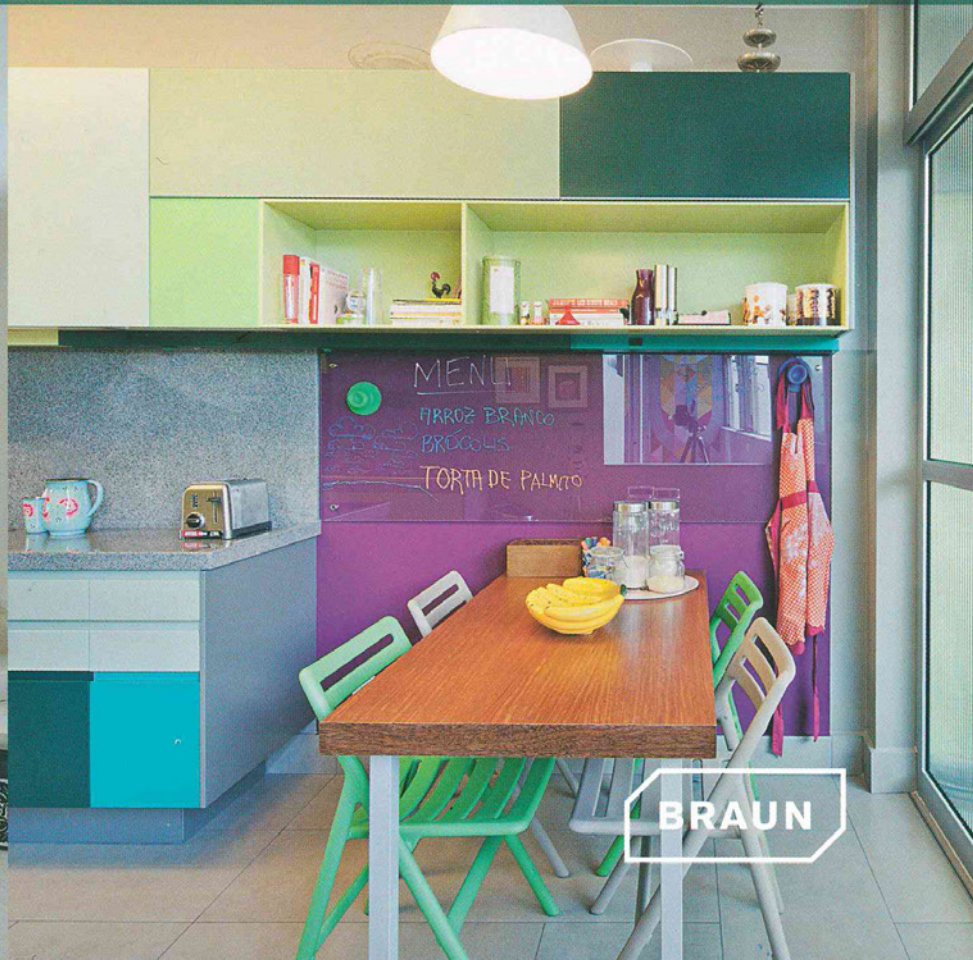

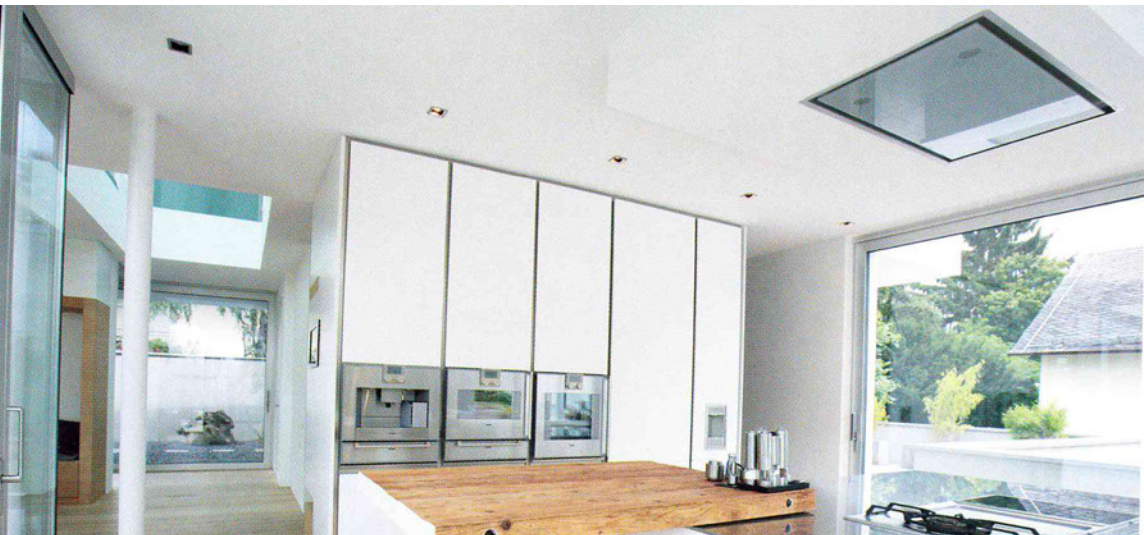

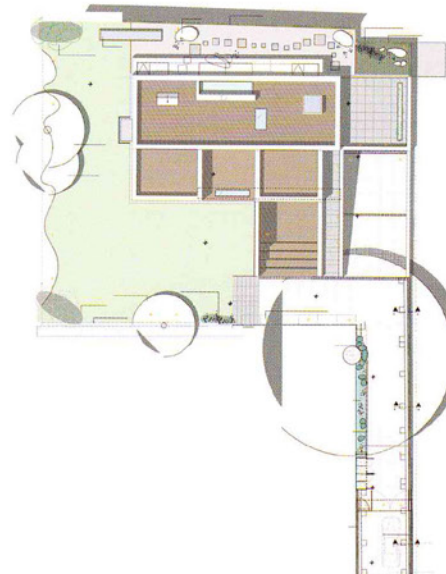
The key focus of this project was to create a home for a young family with two children. The basement houses an additional apartment, a sauna and a multi-media room. Light is drawn into the space via a courtyard, which can also be used as an open-air cinema. The ground floor is organized into cooking, dining and living areas. A breakfast terrace is located above the double garage. The bedrooms are located on the upper floor. The largely transparent façade playfully responds to the alternation of solid and lightweight components, creating an interesting dialogue between inside and outside. An additional advantage of the design, is that part of the plot has not been built upon.







The experience of light in this house was a key focus of the design. During the day residents can enjoy a varied interplay of light and shadow, while at night the house almost looks like something from a James Bond movie.
