

The goal of the project was to design a building biologically sound, low-tech single family house made of solid wood for a family of five to live, reside and work in. The floor plan thrives on the combination of open living and defined spaces without losing its coziness. There are no classic hallways, but rooms that can be used as places to gather. On the first floor, the three children have their places of retreat, and in the hallway or play zone, everyone can come together. The top floor is the parents' area with a large office with two home office workstations, and the hallway provides space for the fitness workout. Lots of built-in cabinets across the floors keep everything organized. The basement has room for guests to stay overnight, and there is a dirt floor and sand pit under the garage.

The open ground floor with a smooth transition to the outside can be used for coming together.

The large roof overhangs protect the façade from the weather.
